Bulleting Cover Art: This illumination, *Wisdom, Prudence, and Knowledge* (ca. 1410-1415), by the Master of the Cité des Dames, depicts divine Wisdom, evoking Proverbs 8, reaching from the heavens to touch an armillary sphere, a symbol of cosmic order and truth. Below, five women represent Prudence and Knowledge, receiving instruction with attentiveness and awe. Created for a manuscript now held in the British Library, this image mirrors Jesus’ promise in John 16. The Spirit of Truth will guide us, not by proclamation alone, but through a journey of conscience, community, and wonder. Truth is not imposed; it is revealed and received.

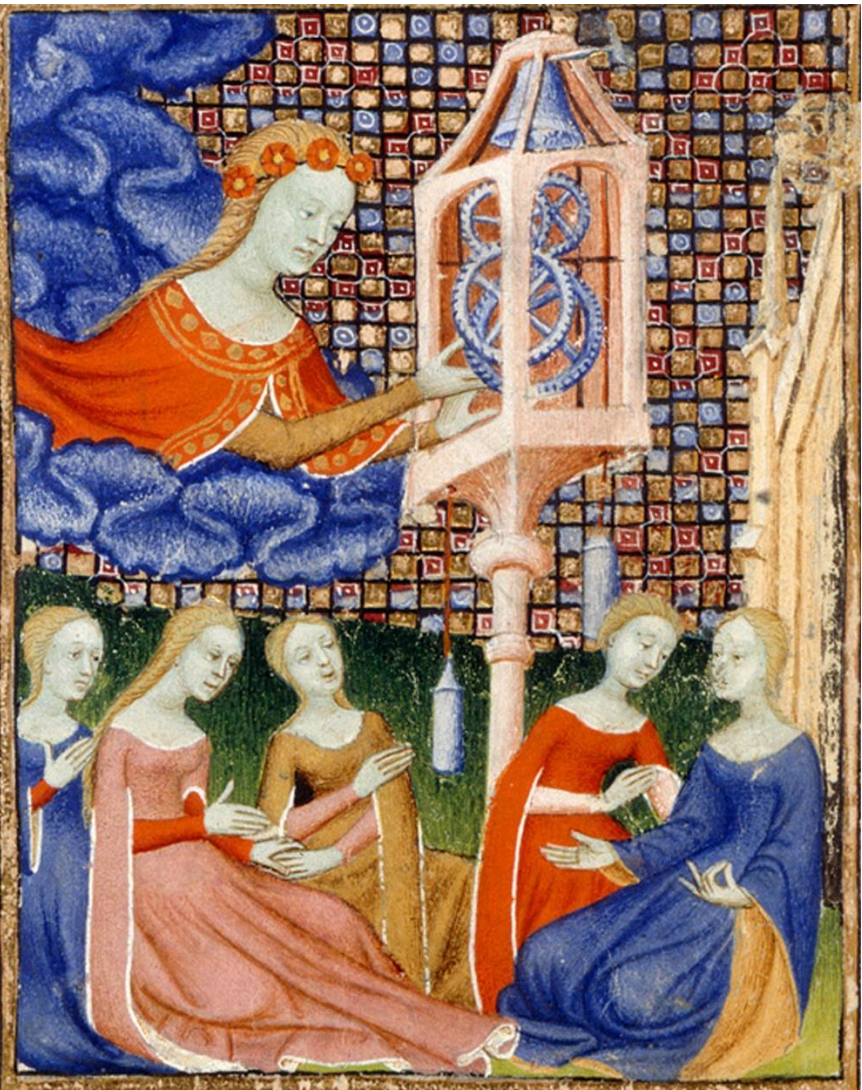
